Points Aren't Enough of a Deterrent to Change Behavior

Points were never meant to be a deterrent.

The underlying philosophy of MYD does not support that mindset. Students will quickly figure out that points are being used coercively, which will decrease both student and parent buy-in. If a student is having difficulty making their day, then the teacher has an obligation to talk with the student, parent(s), former teacher(s), school team, etc. to determine what may be keeping a student from making their day. Building a relationship with the student and the parents is critical for the success of many students, along with the understanding that it may take several years of working with a student to see significant behavioral changes.
