Helping Staff Rediscover and Revalue MYD

1. As a staff, brainstorm the following... "What kind of people do we want our students to be when they leave our class? What attributes do we want them to gain while they are with us?" Develop a list.
2. Then ask... "What programs do we have on our campus that will help us reach these goals?"
3. And, then..."How can we improve implementation of these programs?"
4. MYD often address these goals. Remembering the "why" of choosing MYD provides a renewed focus on implementation with fidelity.
5. Schools with an alive and responsive MYD curriculum have an active MYD Student Committee or a combined MYD Teacher and Student Committee that meets regularly. The student members are key players because they always remain focused on the philosophy; they are always optimistic that they can create change; and they are very concerned that MYD be used fairly by all staff for all students.
